


So you want to get published!

Presenter: Prof. Seamus Hegarty



Seamus Hegarty has been editing academic journals (Educational Research and the European Journal of Special Needs Education) for more than 30 years, plus he has sat on advisory boards for numerous other journals. He also chairs the Publications and Editorial Committee for the International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA) which is the key quality assurance mechanism for all IEA publications. In this workshop, he will lift the veil on what goes on inside the editor's 'black box'. Papers that are poorly conceived and badly written are unlikely to get published – one hopes – but good papers can get overlooked. What can you do to maximise the chances of getting your finely polished paper into your journal of choice? Seamus will draw on his long experience of editing, and getting published himself, to outline steps to take and things to avoid doing. He cannot guarantee your next paper will be published but, if you follow his advice, it will be better!

Seamus Hegarty is a visiting professor at the University of Warwick. He served as Director of the National Foundation for Educational Research for twelve years until his retirement in 2005. He served as Chair of the International Association for the Evaluation of Educational Achievement (IEA) from 2005-12. He has written and co-authored more than 20 books plus numerous papers. He has advised UNESCO and other international bodies on special needs issues for over 30 years. He prepared briefing papers and was Principal Academic Adviser for the Salamanca World Conference in 1994. He held a Marie Curie Visiting Fellowship at the National Institute for Intellectual Disability, Trinity College Dublin in 2010/11. He was appointed to the National Council for Special Education in Ireland, a statutory body, where he held the portfolio for research and dissemination (2007-2012).
